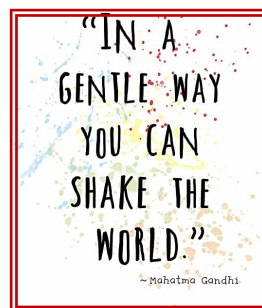
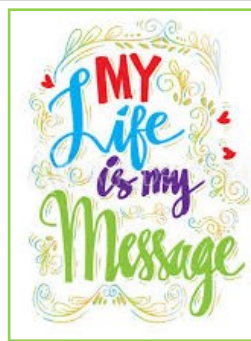

## Transition from 4HCONNECT to 4HONLINE

Texas 4-H will be making the transition from 4HConnect 1.0 to 4HOnline 2.0 on August 15, 2020. 4HOnline will look different when enrollment opens on August 15, 2020 but family profiles, member profiles and login credentials will stay the same.

- 4HConnect will be offline for maintenance August 1-14, 2020.
- 4HConnect will be renamed **4HOnline** on August 15, 2020.
- 4HOnline will look different when enrollment opens on August 15, 2020. Family profiles, member profiles and login credentials will stay the same.
- 4HOnline is mobile friendly and easy to learn.
- 4HOnline will have better accessibility options.
- 4HOnline has major improvements in the payment, search, training, communication, and report areas.
- Families will have to **re-enter credit card information** starting August 15, 2020.
- Every family account must have an **email address**. Visit [google.com](http://google.com) to create a free email account if needed.
- With any new program there will be issues to work out. The time period between August 15 to September 1 will be used to work those out.

## Food Challenge

### Food Categories & Preparation:

There will be four food categories in each age division: Appetizer, Main Dish, Side Dish, and Healthy Dessert. Teams will be randomly assigned to a category, which will not be announced until the day of the contest.

**Preparation:** Each team will create an entire dish/recipe (not a full meal) using the provided key ingredient and grocery store items. Dishes/recipes created should include two or more servings. Teams should present the entire dish/ recipe to the judges and communicate during their presentation what an individual serving size should be. Teams will be responsible for determining the number of servings their dish provides. Teams should not create side or multiple dishes with their ingredients/grocery store items.



THEME: GROCERY GAMES...

Let your local food sources guide your healthy recipe selection with only \$10 to spend!

Dish Categories - Texas 4-H Food Show dish categories are: Appetizer, Main Dish, Side Dish, and Healthy Dessert

**FOOD SHOW DISH PRESENTATION/INTERVIEW:** Food show contestants will prepare a dish on-site at the state contest as traditionally has been done. Contestants should ensure they are choosing healthy recipes that follow guidance in the Recipes for Good Health resource located at <https://texas4-h.tamu.edu/projects/food-nutrition/>. The selection and knowledge of the dish should highlight that the contestant has learned valuable skills and knowledge related to healthy eating and chronic disease prevention. The contestant's recipe must cost less than \$10 to prepare (excluding spices and seasonings).

**SKILL SHOWCASE:** Food show contestants will showcase a skill learned in the food and nutrition project area when they bring their dish to be judged. Youth will demonstrate their knowledge of a skill assigned by judges. All materials to demonstrate this skill will be provided and judges will score the skill based on correct procedures, safety, and other pertinent information related to the skill assigned. The skill will be assigned during designated judging time for each contestant and not prior

**KNOWLEDGE SHOWCASE:** Food show contestants will test their knowledge on food preparation, food safety, kitchen safety, and general nutrition knowledge in the quiz section of the food show. Contestants will be given a 10-question quiz which will contain multiple choice and true/false questions. No study materials will be provided; however, contestants should refer to the Texas 4-H Food & Nutrition page ( <https://texas4-h.tamu.edu/projects/food-nutrition/> ) for potential resources.

## Food Challenge



More than 100,000 youth participate in the 4-H Food & Nutrition Project, learning how to prepare nutritious and safe meals and snacks and adopt behaviors that can help reduce their risk for chronic disease. This contest challenges teams of 4-H members to create a dish using only a predetermined set of ingredients. From these ingredients, team members must identify and prepare the dish, then make a presentation about it to the judges.

### OBJECTIVES

- Provide opportunities for participants to exhibit their knowledge and skill when preparing and presenting a dish
- Provide opportunities for participants to learn from other team members
- Promote teamwork
- Give participants opportunities for public speaking
- Provide leadership opportunities
- Give 4-H members the opportunity to participate in a new, exciting, competitive event

#### Texas 4-H and FFA Livestock Program Ethics Policy Rule #3 Approval Form

Rule #3 of the Texas 4-H and FFA Livestock Program Ethics Policy states that exhibitors and immediate family/guardians are responsible for providing the primary and continuous daily care of livestock projects throughout the validation period. However, there are certain instances when the livestock may be outside of the direct care of the livestock exhibitor, their family, or their supervising County Extension Agent/Agriculture Science Teacher. These instances and the third-party providing care must be approved as noted in Rule #3. This form is to serve as an approval process for state validated livestock projects requesting to be outside of the care of the above listed parties for certain livestock management practices. For more information about Rule #3 or if this form is applicable for your situation, please review the Texas 4-H and FFA Livestock Program Ethics Policy: [www.texasyouthlivestock.com](http://www.texasyouthlivestock.com).

This form must be signed by all parties listed below. Submission of request *does not* ensure the request will be approved. Please know you may not relocate livestock until you have received full approval from your county-level state livestock validation committee. State validated livestock projects outside of the direct care of the exhibitor, family member, or CEA/AST will result in disqualification as outlined in Rule #3. The supervisor should use realistic and reasonable measures for length of time the animal will be outside of the direct care of the exhibitor family in an effort to uphold the integrity of daily care and life skill development. For requests not listed in the drop-down list below, please contact the Species-Specific State Validation Chairperson. Local validation committees may not provide approval on out-of-state requests; out-of-state requests may only be approved by the Species-Specific State Validation Chairperson.

#### Steps for completing this form:

- Livestock exhibitor family is responsible for initiating form, completing all information, and obtaining signatures on the bottom left side of this page.
- The exhibitor family should send this form to the supervising CEA/AST for approval signature.
- If the CEA/AST approves of the request, they send the form to the county-level state validation committee for full approval.
- If the county-level state validation committee approves, the validation chairperson should indicate in the check box at the bottom of this page and sign as proof of the committee approval. If the committee denies the request, the chairperson should indicate in the appropriate check box below, sign, and email this form to the species-specific state validation chairperson. The exhibitor family should be notified of the committee approval or denial.

### 2020-2021 TEXAS 4-H/FFA LIVESTOCK PROGRAM ETHICS POLICY CHANGES

As always, the Texas 4-H/FFA Livestock Program Ethics Policy is updated every year.

Please be aware of the significant changes to Rule #3 and throughout the document.

- Rule #3 Approval Form  
This form and approval process is new this year.

Please familiarize yourself with the process, intent and importance of this document.

"... Prior approval must be granted by the "Species Specific County-Level State Validation Committee" in the event the animal will be outside the direct care of the exhibitor, immediate family/guardian, and/or the supervising County Extension Agent or Agricultural Science Teacher...

...To obtain prior approval, exhibitors must complete an official 4-H/FFA Validation Rule #3 Prior Approval Form. Exhibitors not obtaining prior approval as outlined above will be subject to disqualification of the livestock in question and any other state validated livestock projects.

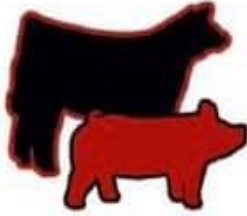
