

<u>Information:</u> The Texas 4-H Program is proud to announce the 2025 States' 4-H International Exchange Summer Hosting Program (<u>FLYER</u>)! For over 20 years, Texan families have opened their hearts and homes to internation youth across the globe, sharing our rich Texan culture and learning about theirs. Program details below:

- Interested host families & host siblings must commit to a 4-week homestay for a Japanese youth (12-18 yrs.). The host period will take place over the summer (July 23-August 16, 2025). *Note: Host families/siblings are not required to be 4-H members.
- Families must have a child of the same gender and within 4 yrs. of the hosted youth. Families without children may host an adult chaperone for a 2-week or 4-week homestay. Interested families may check out the details and apply online today!

2025 Texas 4-H Roping School

June 15-19, 2025 in Stephenville, TX

On June 15 – 19, 2025, the Statewide Texas 4-H Calf Roping and Break-A-Way School will be held in Stephenville, Texas. This event has been developed to encourage young people in 4-H to develop leadership skills, life skills, and to exercise their abilities in working with younger members in roping activities. Participation is open to all districts of the state, with applications being accepted on a first-come, first-serve basis with priority for those who are 12 years of age and older. Space is limited to 50 enrolled 4-H members. **The cost of the school will be \$650 per participant for the week.** This will include group insurance, meals, lodging, cost of the practice calves in the teaching process, and stall rent for one horse. If you want to bring extra horses/reserve an RV spot, you will need to contact Park Your Pony directly to make arrangements and payment for additional stalls.


